After four decades of abandonment, JWB revived the three-story, 18,430-sq. ft. building into a dynamic mixed-use project. The project generated new restaurant, business, and event spaces and a cozy outdoor courtyard. With its dynamic offerings, the adaptive reuse of this historic site not only preserves its legacy but also enhances the city's urban core.
